By plane:

From Fiumicino airport, take the train for Fara Sabina [€ 8,50] and get off at Ostiense station; walk along via delle Cave Ardeatine until you arrive at Piazza di Porta San Paolo; cross the square to via Marmorata. At the first set of traffic lights on your right walk up via di Porta Lavernale

By train:

From the Termini station : metro line B towards Laurentina: get off at the stop Circo Massimo (then 10 min. walking to S. Anselmo); or get off at the stop Piramide (10 min. walking).

By public transport:

Metro line B (towards Laurentina), station Piramide (10 min. walking)

Metro line B (towards Laurentina), station Circo Massimo (10 min. walking)
